Rules

1. Eligibility: Sale lamb exhibitors will be limited to any FFA or 4-H member who resides in the following school districts: Ephrata, Cocalico, Eastern Lancaster County, Conestoga Valley, and Warwick. Non-sale lamb exhibitors are limited to Lancaster County FFA or 4-H members.
2. Ownership: The lambs must have been on feed at least 45 days before the Fair starting date. **ENTRY MUST BE SHOWN BY THE OWNER** except when the owner has more than one entry per class.
3. Showing: All breeds shown together. Lambs may be ewes or wethers; **NO RAMS, NO TAILS.**
4. Entries: Exhibitors are limited to 3 animals. All entries must be mailed to the chairman by September 13th. Entry fees and an "Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship Form" is required (found on page 13), and must accompany entry form. If only one animal is entered per class, it will be judged on its merits.
5. Bedding and Feeding: Bedding will be furnished by the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association. The feed, feed boxes and water buckets must be furnished by the exhibitor who must see that animals are fed and cared for during the ENTIRE fair. The Ephrata Farmers' Day Association will provide a night watchman to stay with the animals.
6. Health:
 - A. No sheep showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or external parasitic disease including foot rot, sore mouth or pink eye will be admitted to any show.
 - B. All sheep must bear an official USDA/APHIS eartag to be exhibited.
 - C. The flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1 is required at weigh-in and must state that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease. Certification by owner and an accredited vet concerning exposure to scrapies must also appear. Rabies vaccination recommended.
7. Sale: All sale animals must be marked with an ear tag prior to check-in. Lambs must weigh 80 pounds to 140 pounds to sell through the sale. No members may sell more than 3 lambs (depending on the number of exhibitors, there may be a limit of 2 per exhibitor).

8. Anyone using an artificial means to change the condition, form or shape of an animal will be disqualified from all classes in which they have entries at the discretion of the sheep show committee.
9. Time: Animals may be checked in from 6:00-9:00 P.M., Monday of fair week. Lambs may be removed Friday after 10:00 P.M. or before 8:00 A.M. Saturday.
10. Each exhibitor is asked to fork out their pen before leaving. Clean-up is 8:00-10:00 a.m. Saturday. Health papers and premiums will be released after 10:00 a.m. provided exhibitor has cleaned up his/her pen(s). If an exhibitor is not present for clean-up he/she will forfeit premiums.

Note: All market lambs will be weighed upon arrival. The lambs will be divided into classes according to weights. It is recommended that no market lamb be shown with any more than 1/2" of fleece.

Premiums: 1st-\$15.00; 2nd-\$12.00; 3rd-\$10.00; 4th-\$8.00; 5th-\$6.00

- 00200 Middleweight Market Lambs
- 00300 Heavyweight Market Lambs
- 00400 Pair of Market Lambs (Any Breed, Any Weight from Classes 100, 200, 300)

Market Non-Sale Class

These lambs will be exhibited, receive ribbons and premiums but will not be sold at the sale. Lambs must be identified at weigh-in time as Non-Sale lambs. (Depending on the number of animals, this class may be divided by weight into more than one class.)

Lamb Showmanship and Fitting

Premiums: 1st-\$10.00; 2nd-\$8.00; 3rd-\$6.00; 4th-\$4.00; 5th-\$2.00

This contest is open to any exhibitor in the show. Each exhibitor must fit and show his own animal.
