WELCOME TO THE 102ND EPHRATA FAIR

General Information: The Ephrata Fair Office is located at 19 South State Street. In case of emergency contact the Fair Office or go to the first aid station. The Ephrata Farmers Day Association will engage police, EMS, guards, and traffic directors to protect the safety of the visitors, exhibits, and concessions at the Fair. The Association assumes no liability for personal injury or for loss or damage to any property of the exhibitors, concessionaires, or patrons due to theft, fire, vandalism, weather conditions, or other causes.

Fair Office: The Fair Office will open on Monday, September 20 and will remain open until Monday, September 27. Hours fair week are Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Sunday 2 to 5 p.m., and Monday 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Fair Office phone number is (717) 733-4451, ext. 1000. This number is available year round through voice mail. You may also email us at fair@ephratafair.org.

Handicapped Parking and Comfort Facilities: Handicapped parking is available in the West Franklin Street parking lot, Lake Street (except parade night), Borough Hall with entrance from Fulton Street, and the Ephrata National Bank off of Locust Street (after banking hours). All lots are controlled by local Boy or Girl Scouts and will have a parking fee charged by them. All handicap locations that we arrange are within the perimeter of the Wednesday night parade, so any parking therein will have restricted exit until the parade is finished. Portable toilets will be located at various locations convenient to the midway and Tent City. A handicapped portable toilet will be located on the south side of the Fair building on South State Street.

Baby Station on Main: Again this year, Align Pregnancy Services (formerly Ephrata Pregnancy Services) at 112 West Main Street will provide their porch for diaper changing, feeding time and resting. Porch is available during fair hours. You are welcome to use the porch whether or not an attendant is present. Please use the Diaper Genie for soiled diapers.

Tent City: Tent City in the Grater Memorial Park features agricultural and commercial exhibits Tuesday through Friday evening. These exhibits include livestock, grain, vegetables, and numerous contests. Delicious food is available at the various refreshment stands.

Shuttle Bus: For the convenience of the public, on **Tuesday**, **Thursday**, and **Friday** from 4 p.m. until 10 p.m., a free shuttle bus will be provided from uptown at the corner of Arch Street/Park Avenue and West Main Street to Tent City. The pickup spot at Tent City will be the corner of Vine and King Streets by the swimming pool. On **Wednesday**, the bus will run from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. In addition to the regular stops, the bus will stop at Cornerstone Mennonite Church on Oak Street and at the Ephrata Borough Building. Free parking for senior citizens attending Senior Day is available at the church. This bus will be handicap accessible.

Emergency Medical Help & First Aid: Ephrata Ambulance Association will staff a first aid station and have an ambulance located on the street near the New Main Theater.

Fair Visitors: We hope you will patronize the businesses that support the Ephrata Fair. Please include a visit to Tent City and our domestic exhibits uptown during your attendance at the **Ephrata Fair**.



NO PETS PERMITTED ON THE MIDWAY

Ephrata Borough has an ordinance prohibiting animals on the midway or at Tent City during the Ephrata Fair. No person shall have an animal on the midway, including the Railroad Station parking lot, of the Ephrata Fair from 7 A.M. Tuesday until 12 midnight Saturday. This ordinance does not apply to dogs which assist the handicapped. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$600.00.

Route of Parade

Parade starts at the Ephrata High School at 7:00 p.m. All units should be available to line up at 5:30 p.m. The line of march will proceed on Oak Boulevard to West Fulton Street, west on Fulton Street to Main Street, east on Main Street to Park Avenue, north on Park Avenue to Chestnut Street, east on Chestnut Street to Church Avenue, south on Church Avenue to Locust Street, east on Locust Street to Lincoln Avenue, south on Lincoln Avenue to East Main Street, west on Main Street to Lake Street, south on Lake Street to East Fulton Street, west on Fulton Street to South State Street, south on State Street to Queen Street, west on Queen Street to disband.

Parade Regulations

- The parade is a continuous moving event with no pausing at any of the judging areas on the parade route
- 2. Handouts at curbside to spectators is permitted. Throwing from vehicles is not permitted. All food or candy must be in original wrapper.
- 3. No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- Band sponsors are allowed one commercial vehicle to follow or proceed the unit they are sponsoring.
- 5. The Parade Committee and the Fair Association may refuse any organization. Decision of the Parade Committee is final.
- 6. All participants driving in the parade must have a valid driver's license and vehicle insurance.

Ephrata Fair Parade is by invitation only! No motorcycles, no horses, no private cars or trucks, unless approved by the fair committee!







GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITS

- 1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Ephrata Fair.
- 2. The Fair management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules and regulations as its judgments may determine.
- 3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage, but the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association is not, in any way, to be held responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss.
- 4. All entries must be grown, produced or made since last year's Fair by the person whose name appears on the entry tag. Only entries by exhibitors from Lancaster County and its contiguous counties will be accepted. Exhibitors in Department 11 must be under nineteen years of age. Ephrata Fair will collect a \$2.00 fee per head for all livestock entries.
- 5. Only one exhibit per class per exhibitor is permitted, except in some livestock classes. Any exhibit can only be entered in one class.
- 6. An exhibit on display cannot be removed before designated removal times or forfeiture of premium will result.
- 7. Chairpersons of department reserve the right of refusing to accept any entry unfit to show. Chairpersons may limit the number of entries per exhibitor.
- 8. When there is no competition in a class, the judges shall award the premium on the merits of the individual exhibit. Same rule applies where there are fewer entries in any class than the number of premiums offered.
- 9. Should any individual enter any article in any other name than that of the bona fide owner, the person making such entry shall be disqualified from the competition.
- 10. The decision of the judges shall be final in all cases, except where mistakes, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the General Chairman may make the decision. The case may be appealed to the Fair Management, whose decision is final. All protests regarding the judging or premium money must be filed in writing at the Fair Office within 48 hours of the conclusion of the Fair.
- 11. During the judging, buildings are to be closed to everyone except fair officials, judges and necessary attendants.
- 12. It shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to properly name the entry/exhibit or breed of livestock he/she is entering. Any exhibit improperly entered will be disqualified to receive a premium, but the judges may make the correction on the entry tag for the exhibitor's benefit.
- 13. Any exhibitor displaying unsportsmanlike conduct toward judges, show officials, exhibitors, or general public will forfeit earned prize money and will be banned from exhibiting the following year.
- 14. Premium checks will be issued to winners of uptown exhibits at the Fair Office on Sunday from 2-4 p.m., and Monday following the fair from 10 a.m.-8 p.m. Premium checks for winners at Tent City will be available on Saturday 8 a.m.-10 a.m. at Grater Park, and then follow the uptown Fair Office schedule. All checks not cashed in 60 days will be void and considered a donation to the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association. **Premium checks will be mailed if a self-addressed stamped envelope is delivered to the Fair Office by Saturday noon week of the Fair.**
- 15. Exhibited items which are not picked up within 14 days following the fair closing date will be discarded at the discretion of the department chairman.
- 16. The Fair management is not responsible for any errors in printing.

ENTERING PROCEDURE FOR EXHIBITORS

Each exhibitor must secure a number before entering an exhibit. This number will be used for <u>all entries</u> at the fair, Uptown or Tent City. Numbers will be issued at exhibit registration areas. Each exhibitor entering 5 or more items may pre-enter by mailing the General Entry Form. Pre-entered uptown exhibitors should pick up exhibitor number and completed exhibit tags at Fair Office (front door) **before entering exhibits.** Pre-entered Tent City exhibitors should pick up completed exhibit tags at Vegetable Tent. NO blank tags given to exhibitors. This procedure will speed up the entry process.

 - C. The flock of origin, including sheep consigned to a show, shall be examined by an accredited veterinarian. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1 is required at weigh-in and must state that he examined the entire flock and found no evidence of contagious, infectious, or external parasitic disease. Certification by owner and an accredited vet concerning exposure to scrapies must also appear.
- 7. Sale: All sale animals must be marked with an ear tag prior to check-in. Lambs must weigh 60 pounds to 160 pounds to sell through the sale. No members may sell more than 3 lambs (depending on the number of exhibitors, there may be a limit of 2 per exhibitor).



- 1. All entries must be mailed to the chairman by September 13.
- Brieding goats cannot be shown in market show classes or vice-versa.
- 3. Entries are limited to **5** breeding goats per exhibitor, with a maximum of 2 goats in any one class. Entries are limited to Lancaster County 4-H and FFA members only. The committee reserves the right to limit the number of breeding goats per exhibitor depending on the number of entries.
- 4. Buck entries are limited to bucks **under 1 year of age**.
- 5. Does over 2 years old who haven't kidded will not be permitted to show.
- 6. Breeding goat entries are limited to Boer goats only. Breeding goats must be registered as fullblood, purebred, or percentage Boer goats with the international BGA, ABGA, or the USBGA. Animals without registration papers will not be permitted to show. Fullbloods, purebreds and percentage goats will show in the same show.
- 7. An original registration certificate must be available the night of check-in for all breeding animals. Animals must have the appropriate registration identification tags and/ or tattoos. Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and owned by the exhibitor at least 45 days before the show. Any exhibitor who tries to falsify registration information will be disqualified.
- 8. Ages will be determined by the birth date on the registration certificate and calculated to September 24.
- 9. Classes will be set by the chairpersons.
- 10. You should use only grooming products that are approved for the use on meat producing animals when fitting any animal for show.
- 11. Drugs administered before the show for the purpose of controlling disposition, enhancing animal quality or showmanship performance are prohibited.
- 12. Health regulations:
 - A. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection: All goats must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed by an accredited veterinarian issued after May 1.
 - B. **Identification:** All goats must be identified by one of the following: an official USDA scrapie eartag, a USDA-approved scrapie tattoo (in addition to individual ID), a USDA-approved custom scrapie eartag, an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID), or a breed registration tattoo (if the tattoo is legible and the registration certificate accompanies the animal). The animal's ID must be included on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- 13. Bedding will be provided by the Ephrata Farmers' Day Association. Feed, feed boxes, and water buckets must be furnished by the exhibitor. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that their animals are fed and cared for during the ENTIRE week of the fair. The Ephrata Farmers Day Association will provide watchmen to stay with the animals overnight.
- 14. Goats may be brought to the fairgrounds on Monday between 6:00 and 8:00 P.M. Goats can be removed on Saturday, 7:00-8:30 A.M. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up their pens.

- 5. Jellies are a clear, sweet spread made from fruit juice, pectin and sugar, which holds its shape when unmolded.
- 6. Marmalades are clear, jellylike preserves made from pulp, juice, and rind of fruits. Ex: Citrus fruits.





WHATEVER IT TAKES: Tractors will be checked for obvious safety problems when weighed in. You may enter a tractor in more than one class by adding weight but only once in each class. We will determine how many classes a tractor may pull by the amount of tractors in the park; we would like to finish by 10:30 P.M. Entry fee is \$10 per class. Everyone pulls at their own risk and the owners of tractors are responsible for any damage or injury by their equipment. Any argument will be discussed by the pulling committee. Rules

- 1. All tractor owners must sign a release form concerning responsibility of their equipment.

Anything announced at the driver's meeting will take preference over what is printed in the Fair Book. The committee is looking at other options for sled, etc.






